

# **Living Water: The Only Source That Truly Satisfies**

## **Page 1 – The Promise of Living Water**

Jesus' words to the Samaritan woman at the well remain one of the most powerful promises in Scripture:

“But whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.”

— John 4:14, NKJV

This was more than a casual conversation—it was a divine appointment.

Cultural barriers were broken – Jews and Samaritans avoided each other, yet Jesus engaged her.

Social barriers were broken – Men did not usually speak privately with women, but Jesus did.

Spiritual barriers were broken – She came carrying shame, but Jesus offered her grace.

Jesus uses the imagery of living water to contrast with ordinary well water.

Water from the well could satisfy thirst only for a short time.

The water Jesus gives brings eternal satisfaction.

This water is a picture of the Holy Spirit, who comes to live within those who believe.

The “fountain” imagery matters. Unlike a cistern or stagnant pool, a spring is alive, fresh, and overflowing. That’s the kind of life Christ offers—one that is abundant, renewing, and unending.

## **Page 2 – Why We Need This Living Water**

Every human being is thirsty—not just physically, but spiritually. We all long for:

Meaning in life

Peace in chaos

Love and acceptance

Hope for the future

The world offers many substitutes:

Success and achievement

Wealth and possessions

Relationships and approval from others

Entertainment and temporary pleasures

But none of these satisfy for long. They are like drinking saltwater—it looks like it will quench your thirst, but it only leaves you emptier than before.

Jesus' words invite us to ask:

What “wells” have I been drinking from?

Am I looking for life in things that cannot truly give it?

Have I mistaken temporary satisfaction for lasting fulfillment?

The truth: Only Jesus satisfies the deepest longings of the soul.

“He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.”

— John 7:38, NKJV

This is not a trickle. It is an overflowing river that refreshes us and brings life to those around us.

### **Page 3 – Living in the Overflow**

The gift of living water is not just for survival—it is meant to transform us and flow outward into the lives of others.

What living water does in us:

Brings peace in times of trouble

Fills us with joy that circumstances cannot take away

Renews our strength when we feel weary

Produces fruit in our character:

Love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (Galatians 5:22–23, NKJV)

What living water does through us:

Encourages those around us

Demonstrates God's grace to the broken

Invites others to experience Jesus for themselves

We see this in the Samaritan woman's story. After her encounter, she ran to tell her village:

"Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did. Could this be the Christ?"

— John 4:29, NKJV

Her life was transformed, and her testimony became the spark for others to believe.

This is the eternal promise of Jesus: His living water refreshes us now and prepares us for everlasting life in His presence.

"And the Spirit and the bride say, 'Come!' And let him who hears say, 'Come!' And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely."

— Revelation 22:17, NKJV
